MEAL CHARGE

The Board of Education recognizes that, on occasion, students may forget to bring meal money to school not have enough funds for a meal. To ensure that students do not go hungry, but also to promote responsible student behavior and to minimize the fiscal burden on the district, all district schools shall follow guidelines with regard to meal charges to be paid back at a later date subject to the terms in this policy.

- No more than 2 meals (\$5.00) (\$6.20) per student may be charged at the high school or middle school and no more than 14 meals (\$39.90) at the elementary;
- Only regular <u>reimbursable</u> meals may be charged, that is, only what is on the menu;
- No snacks or a' la carte items may be charged;
- A computer-generated point of sale system shall be used for identifying and recording all charged meals, as well as for collecting repayments

The district shall discretely notify parents of student at regular intervals of negative balances.

This policy applies to all paying students whether they are paying full-price, or reducedprice, or free lunch.

A student who abuses this policy may be denied a meal. If school authorities suspect that a student may be abusing this policy, they must first provide written notice to the parent that if he/she continues to abuse this policy, the privilege of charging meals will be refused. <u>Students eligible for free meals shall not be denied a reimburseable meal,</u> <u>even if they have accrued a negative balance from other cafeteria purchases. No</u> <u>student with unpaid charges will be prohibited from purchasing a regular</u> <u>reimbursable meal.</u>

All schools shall maintain a system for accounting for charged meals that follows state guidelines.

All negative (unpaid) balances left on record by inactive students will be reimbursed to the Lunch Fund (C) by the General Fund (A).

<u>Remaining funds will be carried over to the next school year. Parents/guardians</u> <u>may request balance refunds or transfers to other students (e.g. siblings, unpaid</u> <u>accounts). All transfers must be in writing. Unclaimed funds remaining after three</u> <u>months shall be absorbed by the school meal account.</u> Ref: Child Nutrition Act of 1966, 42 U.S.C. 1771 et seq.
